Topic (Science - Predators)

Predators is a Science based topic focusing on animal predators and their habitats. Children will also learn to group animals scientifically and understand food chains. Additionally, children will be learning about animal and human nutrition, and healthy eating. Children will learn and identify that humans and some animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement.

Geography

This first half term children will be learning about the River Tees. This will include map work, locating local towns including Billingham. Additionally children will consolidate their understanding of the British Isles and World Continents.

History

In the second half term we will be looking through the ages (Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age) including historical inquiry and learn about primary and secondary source.

Numeracy

This term we will be consolidating place value with numbers to 1000. Develop mental and written strategies for the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). Children will be tested weekly on their times tables and will have the opportunity to access Times Tables Rockstars, which can be accessed at home. The more children practice their times tables, the greater impact this will have in their progress in all areas of maths

Music

We will be developing an understanding of rhythm and pulse through various activities. We shall also be looking at the basics of musical notation.
